

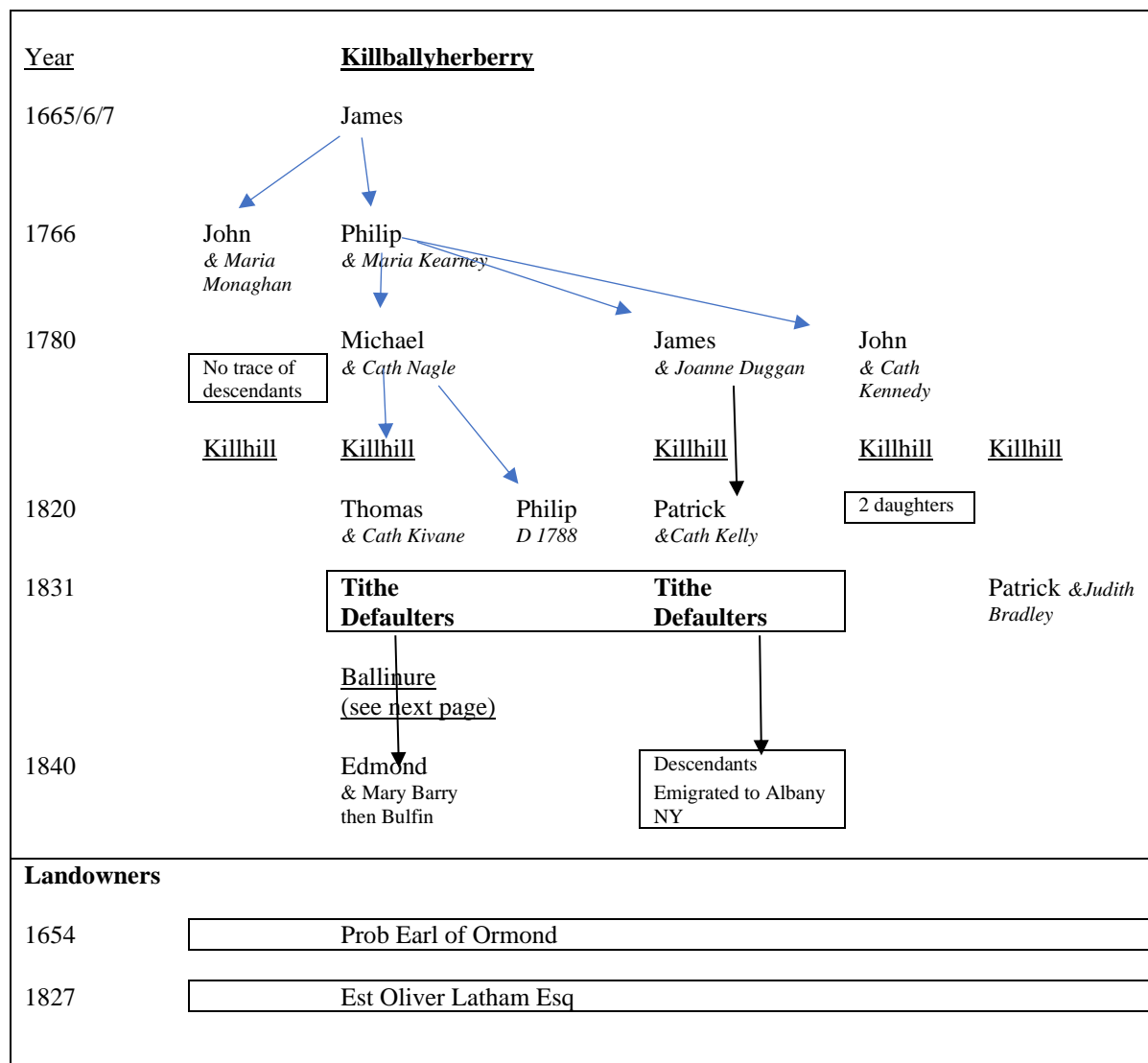
Tipperary Families – Ballinure/Killenaule area (Trees # 1, 6, 8, 9 and 10)

This is the area where I think it is most likely that the first Hayde immigrant(s) to Ireland settled. They were here in 1666/67 and is the area of highest numbers in the 1800s. From here they spread north to Ballingarry/Gortnahoe/Kilcooly and Thurles and south to Cashel, Drangan, Fethard and Clonmel. They also spread further north to Kilkenny, Kildare, Wicklow, Carlow and Dublin.

The Landowners

Earl of Ormond

This is probably. James Butler, 12th earl and 1st duke of Ormonde, (born October 19, 1610, [London, England](#)—died July 21, 1688, Kingston Lacy, [Dorset](#)), Anglo-Irish Protestant who was the leading agent of English royal authority in [Ireland](#) during much of the period from the beginning of the [English Civil Wars \(1642–51\)](#) to the [Glorious Revolution](#) (1688–89).

He grew up in England and in 1633 succeeded to the earldom of Ormonde. That same year he began his active career in Ireland by offering his services to Lord Deputy [Thomas Wentworth](#) (later earl of Strafford). Upon the outbreak of the Roman Catholic rebellion in Ireland in 1641, Ormonde was appointed a lieutenant general in the English [army](#). He defeated the rebels of the Catholic confederacy at Kiltrush, Munster (April 15, 1642), and at New Ross, Leinster (March 18, 1643). Those triumphs, however, did not prevent the confederates from overrunning most of the country. Ormonde's attempts to conclude a peace were blocked by a Catholic faction that advocated complete independence for Ireland. The situation deteriorated further, and in July 1647 Ormonde departed from Ireland, leaving the Protestant cause in the hands of the parliamentarians, who had defeated King [Charles I](#) in the first English Civil War (1642–46).

Returning to Ireland in September 1648, Ormonde concluded a peace with the confederacy (January 1649). He then rallied Protestant royalists and Catholic confederates in support of [Charles II](#), son and successor of [Charles I](#). For several months most of Ireland was under Ormonde's control. But the parliamentarian general [Oliver Cromwell](#) landed at [Dublin](#) in August 1649 and swiftly conquered the country for Parliament. Ormonde fled to [France](#) and became one of Charles II's closest advisers at his court-in-exile in Paris.

Oliver Latham

In the mid 19th century Oliver Latham held land in the parishes of Ballysheehan and Brickendown, while William Latham held land in the parishes of Magowry and Peppardstown, barony of Middlethird, county Tipperary. William Hamilton Latham of Ballysheehan House, was the son of William Latham and Anne Pennefather

In June 1854, the lands of Magowry and part of Corbally, 651 acres in the barony of Middlethird, the estate of "William Hamilton Latham and others" were advertised for sale. The sale was postponed until October. These lands were held on leases from Hamilton Lowe to Mary Strang dated 1809 and to Mathew Latham dated 1792 for the lives of Mathew and his two sons Oliver and Mathew Latham. John Mullally held a mortgage on the lands for money lent to William Hamilton Latham.

John Ryan

John Bagswell owned Noan in 1830 and those that had large plots of land included John Ryan and, to a lesser extent, Judith Drew.

Avery Jordan

Avery was an agent that managed a large number of estates. He lived at the Racecourse lodge near Cashel.

In 1829, he was the town clerk of Cashel.

Henry Laffan

Henry Laffan was granted 120 acres of land at Graystown in 1305. Graystown then became the chief seat of his descendants. Thomas Laffan of Graystown was a Member of Parliament for Tipperary in 1613. The Laffans lost their lands in Tipperary following the Cromwellian conquest and were transplanted to Connaught.

The land was probably part of what was given to Nathaniel Taylor by Cromwell.

Taylor - Noan and Ballinure

In 1666 Nathaniel Taylor, an officer in Cromwell's army, was ganted an estate of approximately 1,000 acres in the barony of Slievardagh, county Tipperary, including the townland of Noan. His grandson, Lovelace Taylor, purchased Ballinure in 1742.

Lovelace's son Godfrey Taylor of Noan, county Tipperary, married as his second wife, Lydia, daughter and heir of Nicholas Bacon, in 1758. Edward Taylor of Noan, barony of Slievardagh, county Tipperary, married Elizabeth Hewetson of Kilkenny and had three sons who all died childless and a daughter Anne. Edward died in 1802 and was succeeded by his son Nathaniel who died in 1828. His daughter Anne married John Bagwell of Kilmore in 1819 and the Bagwell family was in possession of this estate by the mid 19th century. It was sold to Stanley Black in 1853.

A younger brother of Edward, Nathaniel Taylor, inherited Ballinure, a townland bordering Noan, but without a residence. Godfrey L. Taylor of Durrow, Queen's County (Laois), owned 996 acres in county Tipperary in the 1870s. In the mid 19th century the Taylor estate was in the parishes of Graystown, barony of Slievardagh, Peppardstown and Rathcool, barony of Middlethird. The estate of the trustees of the will of Godfrey Taylor at Rathkenny, barony of Middlethird, county Tipperary, was advertised for sale in May 1854.

Godfrey Taylor was the landowner at Coolmoynes where Hayde families were present from 1766.

Head

The Head family descend from Michael Head, Sheriff of the city of Waterford in 1672 and Mayor in 1684. His son, John, married Elizabeth, daughter and heir of Samuel Wade of Derry, county Tipperary. Their two grandsons were Michael, of Derry Castle and John, of Ashley Park.

At the time of Griffith's Valuation, Reverend John Head, Dean of Killaloe (third son of Michael), held three townlands in the parish of Ballynaclogh, barony of Upper Ormond, county Tipperary while William H. Head, held an estate in the barony of Lower Ormond, parishes of Dorrha, Lorrha, Modreeny and Templeachally. In 1815 Reverend John had married Susan, daughter of Edward Hawke Darby of the Leap Castle family. The estate of Edward Head at Ballykinash and Turlough, barony of Upper Ormond was advertised for sale in July 1864. Ballykanash was advertised again in February 1877. The Irish Times reported the purchase of this lot by Adam Mitchell for over £4000.

In the 1870s Henry Darby Head of Ballyquiveen, Nenagh, owned 941 acres in county Tipperary. John Head of Ashley Park, married Phoebe Toler, sister of the 1st Earl of Norbury, and had a son, Lieutenant General Michael Head of Modreeney House, who was succeeded in 1827 by his only child, William Henry Head of Derrylahan Park, Parsonstown. William H. Head bought the Walsh estate in the late 1850s and built Derrylahan Park in 1862. Some of his property was sold in the Landed Estates Court in June 1869. It was purchased in trust by Mr. Mitchell. William H. Head owned 2,330 acres in county Tipperary in the 1870s.¹

This family is not connected to the Hayde/Hade/Heade families.

Townlands

Noan

Noan consists of 929 acres and probably correlates to the circa 1,000 acres Nathaniel Taylor was granted by Cromwell in 1666.

It borders:

- Ballaghboy to the south
- Ballinure to the west
- Burnchurch and Maneraghshill to the east
- Curraheen, Grallagh and Lurgoe to the north

It also has the following subtownlands:

- Piercetown in the west bordering Ballinure parish
- Ballyregan in the east
- Ballynaglaragh in the north

Ballinure

Ballinure consists of 854 acres. It borders:

- Ballaghboy to the south
- Cooleagh to the west
- Garraun to the south
- Grallagh to the north
- Newtown to the west
- Noan to the east

It has the one subtownland of Kilcarney in its north. Killballyherbery is to the south of Garraun. Garraun is between Ballinure and Dually.

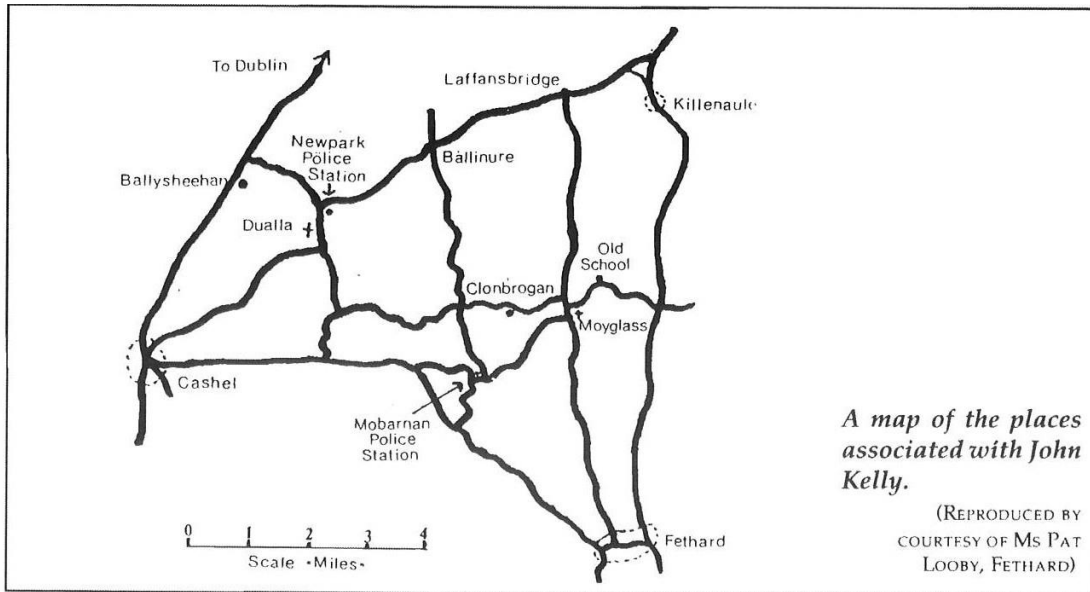
In this parish were the marriages of:

- Helena Heade (prob b 1749) to Thomas Dwyer from parish of St Johns, 1771. They had a family in the 1770s.
- Mariam Head to Michael Kearney 1778 from Mogorbey
- Margaret Head to Andrew Quigley 1782, Killenaule
- Alice Head (prob b 1762) to Edmund Looby 1789
- Bridget Head to Johannam Serag 1789
- Bridget Head to Roger Driskill 1797
- Ellen Head to Johann Kelly 1799 (see below)
- Mary Hayd (parish Dually) (prob b 1815 of Pat and Cath) to William Dyer (parish Boherlahan) 1835. Wit also a Hayd (see Martin Dyer advertising in Boston Pilot 1865)
- Lizzie Hayde to Patrick Connors (from Rosegreen) Nov 1878. Wit Mary Hayde. (also in civils). Father Edmond, Ballinure. Eliza aged 20. Prob dau of Cath Liddy rather than Marg Barr or Marg Byrne.

The John Kelly married to Ellen Head 16 June 1799 in Moyglass Church (as above) is related to the famous Australian criminal Ned Kelly. A map produced by the Tipperary Historical Journal in 1990 explained the background in some detail and included the following map:

In the 1850s maps there is a village called Killenaule just south of Ballinure. This is not to be confused with the larger town and parish of Killenaule further east.

A Richard Heade b Ireland 1827 was in St Louis by 1870. He had married a Bridget circa 1861. Given the rarity of Richard as a Christian name, there is probably a connection to the Richards in this parish.

¹² Thomas Hayde who joined the Dublin Met Police in 1850 aged 27 (b 1823) recorded his home location as the Post Town of Littleton, Moycarkey. His death in the civil records in 1864 recorded his age as 46 (ie b 1818). He had a daughter Mary in Clonmel who married in 1877 aged 18 (b 1859).

¹³ There was also a James Hayde, who joined the RIC in 1849, born in Tipperary North in 1826. He resigned in 1853 and emigrated to America. He arrived on the Compromise 7 Sept 1853. However I have not found him American census records.

¹⁴ Michael b 1829 joined RIC and then army in 1850 in Dublin. His records stated he was born Moycarky parish. His sister Catherine b 1846 married a Ryan and Catherine Roach was a niece (see 1901 census Clonmel). A Michael Hayde aged 56 died in Thurles in 1887 (b 1831). He was an army pensioner and a bachelor. He is probably the same person.
