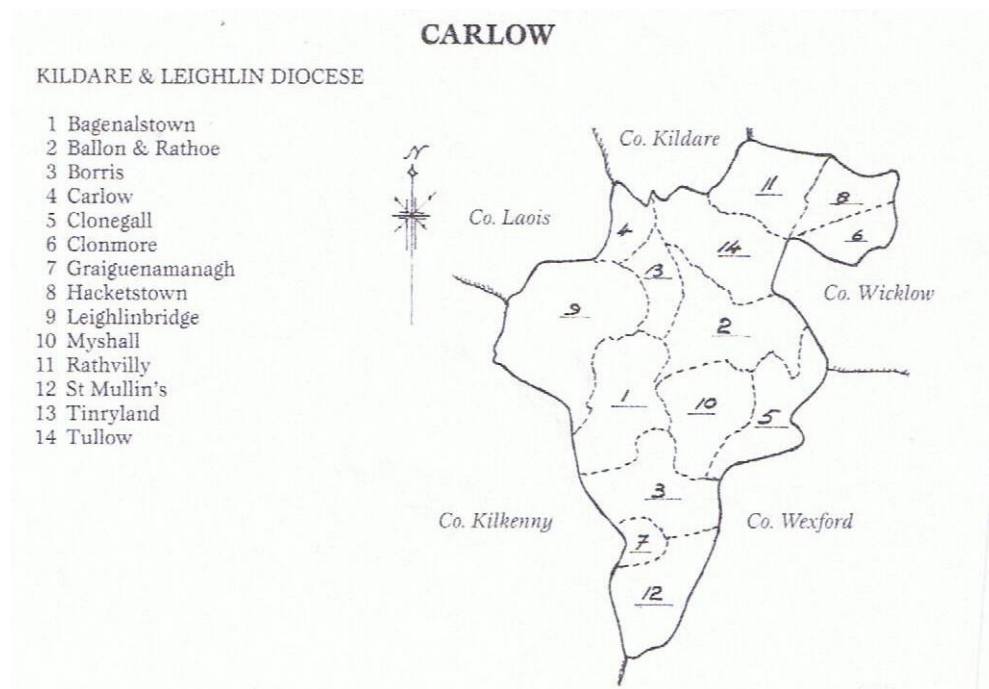

Householders in Parish of Carlow – 1669

This had nothing relevant (However it appeared to be just Carlow township).

17th Century Leases – 1677, 1678, 1680 and 1681

Extracts of these found on-line (NLI MF no 4767) only contain references to a John Head who had a lease over a tenement and plot in Castle Street and Tullagh Street over his lifetime from 1677.

Leighlin Administration Bonds

These are indexed in a variety of places however the only entry of interest is a Walter Headon in 1724 from Newstone.

Catholic Convert Rolls – 1790

These recorded Catholics (ie Papists) that converted to Church of Ireland (ie Protestant). They recorded in 1790:

- Elizth Walker, wife of Saml
- Elizth Walker, wife of Chrstr. Both of Ballylynane.

The Walker family is relevant as in 1819 John Hade leased land from a Chris Walker, late Sgt of Carlow Militia. His sons were William and Patrick. The same piece of land was leased by Patrick Headen in 1770 from Christopher Walker.

Note that in the Burton Family papers Elizabeth Walker was deemed to be of unsound mind in the early 1800s.

Oaths of Allegience – 1797

Oaths of Allegience were demanded of tenants by the Crown authorities prior to the rebellion of 1798. Threat of tortue by the Militia and fear of losing their tenancy ensured cooperation.

This is in the Carlow Library and I also obtained a list from Aubrey that included:

Dick (Richard) Heade
John Hade
Thomas Hade

This was signed at Burton Hall on 20 November 1797. They all just made their mark.

John and Thomas were prob in Ballylennon in 1830. The link to Richard is uncertain when looking at the Parish records.

The 1798 Rebellion in Carlow

An autobiography of William Farrell written between 1832 and 1845 consisted of 187 parchment pages and contained eyewitness accounts of events. The names noted as included in this book include:

- Mick Heydon
- Dick Heydon of the Carlow Yeoman Infrantry
- Richy Heydon

A copy of this book is held in the Carlow Library under the title 'Voice of Rebellion'.

The Jackson Collection – 1799

A new Act was passed in 1793 providing for raising a local force, both Protestant and Catholic, by ballot. This militia was intended to act mainly as a Police Force rather than as an army. The tasks involved quelling riots and feuds, escorting coaches, protecting bailiffs, arresting criminals, etc.

In practice, Protestants became officers and the vast majority of the men were Catholics. The rank and file of the Militia was predominately of the peasant and artisan class.

In Carlow, a regiment was first raised on 20 April 1793 by Col. Bruen, a large landowner in the area. He appointed a number of Lieutenants including Constantine Brough.

The Jackson Collection is a list of men who joined the Carlow Militia. The Militia disembodied in 1802 until war broke out later in the year. The regiment was on duty during the Napoleonic war but was disembodied in March 1816.

The information is available in the Carlow Library and I obtained the following extract from Aubrey Fenian in July 2006:

Thomas Hade from parish of Ballylennon and Killyshain was listed on the first page.

The Carlow library confirmed that Thos Hade joined Carlow Militia 10 October 1799 under Captain Constantine Brough. WO13/2629 at PRO showed that Tom was discharged 27/1/1800 for 60th Regt – although there is no record of him joining 60th (*check again*). It also showed a Pat Hood/Hodd recruited 13 March 1800 and discharged 2 May 1800 but I don't think it is related.

Thomas prob married Cath Nixon and was in Ballylennon in 1830.

1790 Map

Aubrey had obtained this map from a scientific library in Dublin (Dawson St). It showed Ballyheath as a place name that is currently known as Ballyhade.

Granite History

When talking to Aubrey, he discussed the granite extraction that took place in the area that attracted workers to the area. This possibly explains the movement between Tipperary and Carlow.

Register of Voters – 1838

This register contained the following:

- Patrick Haydon from Tinryland.
- Edward Headon from Castlemore
- James Headon from Butler's Grange
- Brien Haydon and Loughlin Haydon both from Maplestown

Famine Relief – 1847

There were no Hade/Hayde/Heade references in the list for Palatine obtained by Aubrey.

William Smith O'Brien Petition

In 1848, Pattk Hayde from Carlow added his name to this petition.

Pigots Directory

1824– Nothing found in Carlow Town, Hacketstown, Leighlin Bridge or Tullow.

1846– Nothing found in County Carlow

Civil Registrations and Wills

There were no Hayde or Heade civil registrations for Carlow nor were there any post 1858 Hayde wills recorded. There were however many entries in the civil registrations and the wills index for Hade. It appears that subsequent generations have adopted the Hade name.

The Burton Estate

Benjamin Burton purchased the townland of Ballinakill in 1712 and renamed it Burton Hall.

Benjamin Burton was the grandson of Thomas Burton who left England in 1610 with his brother Francis. Their father, Edward, was a Protestant from Salop who narrowly escaped death for treason during the reign of the Catholic queen Mary.

Benjamin founded the Burton Bank in Dublin in the early 1700s. This however collapsed in 1735 but Burton Hall and its 4,500 acres survived in family hands.

He was one of a relatively small number of Palatine commissioners of 1709 who succeeded in becoming a landlord to German colonists. He managed to retain 15 of his allocation of 20 families during the first phase of colonization in 1709-11. Moreover, a village known as Palatine evolved on the edge of Burton Hall demesne. While this provides a connection between Germany and Ireland, I do not think that we were part of this 1709 settlement.

When searching the parish records for Carlow many of the references to Hayde (as well as Hade and Heade) were for Burton Hall, Ballylennon, Ballyvergal, Rutland, Palatine, Straboe, all close by. Also shown on this map is Ballyhade.

I need to find the tenant records of Burton Hall.

I found an article by Desmond Norton of the University College, Dublin that says that he has some of the records of the agents that managed Burton Hall (and other properties owned by Sir Charles Burton in Ireland) in the 1840s. This information included reference to a Michael Hade acting as a bailiff on the Pollerton property in the 1840s at an annual salary of £5.

The Carlow Library has some papers of the Burton family and they have been transcribed in www.rootsweb.ancestry.com The transcriptions are mainly to do with land transactions and the only relevant entries are:

- A Deed in 1789 referring to the place of Ballyhade,
- A Lease in 1808 to a Henry Headon of Dublin, clerk, and Francis Headon (nee Hogan, his wife), late of Carlow, renewing a 1738 lease of houses and a garden in Tallow Gate, Carlow.
- In 1818, mention of Eliza Dorothea Walker who has not been of sound mind since 1798. Her next of kin are apparently named in the documents.

- In 1847 and 1858, mention of a James Hade, civil engineer of Carlow, who drew up various documents.

Other Relevant Families

It appears that Hayde/Hade families were in Ballylennon by 1770 and Straboe shortly thereafter. The Ballylennon reference is supported by the lease of land from Christopher Walker for 31 years in 1770.

It appears that the Walker family owned land in Ballylennon and elsewhere in the 1700s. Where did they come from? Where did they get their staff? Did they own land in Tipperary at the time?

Interestingly, by 1876 the Walker family was no longer a significant land owner in the area. It may have been broken up after the death of Elizabeth Walker in the early 1800s. She gifted most of the assets to charities and moved to Dublin.

The Tighe family were significant land owners by 1876 and were the landlords for some of the Hade/Hayde families in the 1850s. The records of the Tighe family are held in the National Library of Ireland – Ms 873 (1836-59 rent rolls).

Conclusion

In the 1830s there were four Hayde or Hade families in the Carlow area:

- John, Thomas and James at Ballylennon (sons of Patrick who leased land from Chris Walker in the 1700s).
- Michael at Rutland. In 1843 he was a bailiff on Burton Hall property.
- John at Ballyvergal, who farmed land owned by William Burton.
- Thomas, Richard, Patrick and Michael at Straboe

The parish records in the early 1800s predominately used the name Hade. The Tithe records used Hayde for the families at Ballylennon, Ballyvergal and Rutland and Hade for the Straboe family. It appears that the descendants of these families have used the surname Hade. Some families remain in the area (11 in the 1996 phone book) while others have moved to Dublin or emigrated to America.

As there were only about 3 or 4 families in the area in 1830 it indicates that either they had only been there for perhaps 2 or 3 generations. The early parish records (Tullow – 1763 and Rathvilly – 1797) are not helpful as they record many Haydens, Haydons etc and no Hades or Haydes. The earliest deed of lease that I could find (1770) also refers to a Headen.

The DNA profile of a descendant of this family is the same as that of Hayde/Heade families from Tipperary. A possible explanation for this is the granite extraction work that was undertaken in the area as mentioned by Aubrey Fenian in July 2006. I have found many ancestors from Tipperary that were masons or similar in the late 1800s and early 1900s and therefore we seem to have an association with this trade.

My assumption therefore is that a part(s) of the family moved to Carlow from Tipperary in the 1700s. They could have moved to work as masons in the quarries or as farmers for a land owner that they knew from Tipperary.

The families at Ballyvergal and Rutland were clearly linked to the Burton estate while the Ballylennon family is linked to the Walker family, and were probably the originals in the area. Both the land owning families seemed to be sympathetic to Catholics.

I suspect that the Walker family owned land in Tipperary and the offer of land to farm in Ballylennon enticed a Hayde/Hade family north.

Many descendants emigrated to America.
