A Henry Hayde b 1810 joined the army in 1825 at Kilkenny. He was a tailor, born Oldmeldrum (Scotland). At this time his father (Richard) was in Dublin. Richard Hayde who joined the army in 1790 at the age of 26 (b 1764) is probably Henry's father. Richard's army records stated he was born St Marys. He received the Waterloo service medal 1816/17 was discharged 1814. He was a barber by trade. He is probably the Richard who mar Elizabeth Brown.

Patt and Robert Heade, both flour manufacturers from Kilkenny City, signed the oath of allegiance to the king in 1779. Patt is clearly the Patrick who married Catherine Carroll in 1777 above.

Robert is prob the father of Henry as well as Patt as there is no Robert in the parish records.

Note that there was a Robert at Lismalin in 1665.

John Haide b 1846 from St Canice joined Kilkenny Militia 1862 and then 36th Foot in 1863. He died in 1869. Although not found in the parish records, he is probably another son of James and Mary.

It appears that James died circ 1869 and his widow took two children to America in 1870. The subsequent movements of Ellen and the children can be traced as follows:

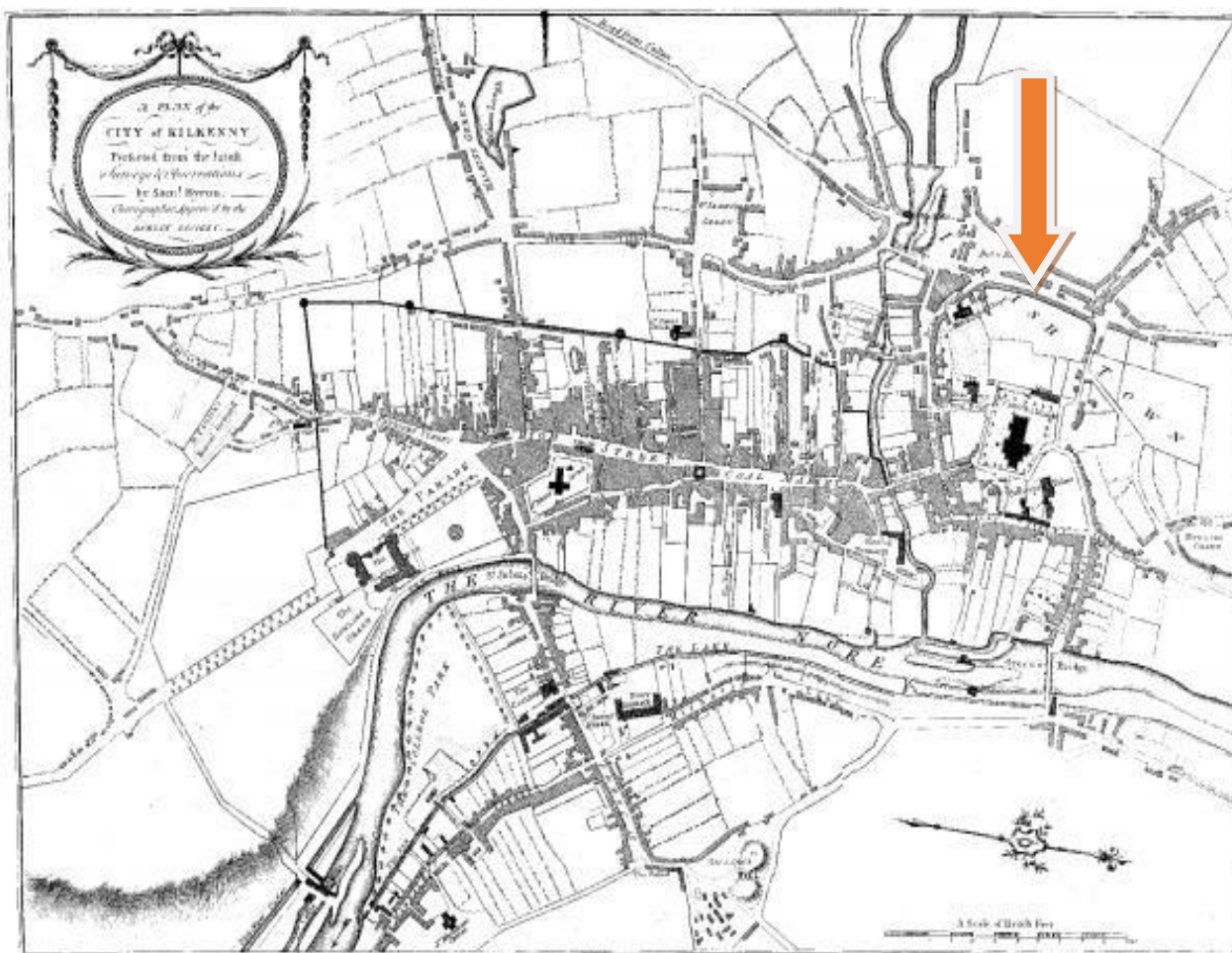

The name Kilkenny is an anglicisation of a Gaelic name that translates as the Church of St Canice. It was the site of Catholic worship established by St Canice in the sixth century. It is in the Northern part of Kilkenny known as Irishtown.

Irishtown was quite separate from the rest of Kilkenny in the 16th century. It had its own walls, its own Corporation and its own laws. It was the oldest part of Kilkenny and is the area north of the river Breagh highlighted by the arrow on the map above. This river runs into the river Nore and is shown at the top right hand side of the map.

The rest of Kilkenny was the Hightown. To the south was St Mary's and across the river to the east was St John's.

In the 1700s Kilkenny became a hive of revolutionary activity and rebels staged protests and insurrections around the county. The rebels staged an unsuccessful rebellion in 1798 and Kilkenny City was briefly placed under martial law.

Kilkenny City Families – Conclusion

The family in Irishtown, Kilkenny City in 1739 could be linked to any family in the surrounding counties. They presumably moved there from a rural area.

It appears that descendants may have subsequently moved to St John's and St Mary's by the 1800s. One of the families was a miller. Descendants emigrated to America in 1870. I have not found a living descendant of this family.
