Washington Co is in the northern part of NY State by the border with Vermont. Charles is probably related to the John Hade who arrived in New England from Ireland in 1766.

- Jacob Heyde b 1777 (Dutch Reformed Church Greene, NY ?)
- Maria Heyde b 1779 (Dutch Reformed Church Greene, NY ?)
- John Heid b 1783 (Christ Lutheran Church, York²) *John m Hannah (or Anna Maria) and had 10 children William, Daniel, Jacob, Joseph, Catherine, John, Hannah, Mary, Emmanuel and David. John died 1863.*
- Jacob Heid b 1789 (Pike Twp, Berks³)
- John Jacob Heid b 1790 (Christ Lutheran Church, York)
- Sophia Heid b 1791 (Pike Twp, Berks)
(Not all children accounted for)

This family could be either:

- a) Descended from Johan Justus Hayd and Anna Maria Mercklin who arrived from the Palatine in 1709 (*however Hite research has this family as settling in Virginia*), or
- b) A John Jacob Hayd who arrived from Germany in 1752.
- c) Johan Henrich Heyde who arrived in 1765.

- Abraham Heid b 1786 (New Hanover, Montgomery Co⁵)
- Jacob Heid b 1788 (Pike Twp, Berks)
- Johannes Heid b 1790 (Pike Twp, Berks)
- George Heid b 1793 (Pike Twp, Berks)
- Daniel Heid b 1797 (Pike Twp, Berks)
- *Perhaps other male aged over 16 may have been a relation.*

George is probably the son of Johan George and Maria Sarah who had⁶:

- Johann Georg Heide, b 3 March 1749, reformed, (Trinity Lutheran Church, Lancaster Co)
- Anna Maria Heide, b 30 Sept 1750, reformed, (Trinity Lutheran Church⁷)
- Maria Phillippina Hayde, b March 1754 (Trinity Lutheran Church)
- Jacob Heid, b 23 April 1755 (Trinity Lutheran Church)
- George Michael Hayde, b Jan 1757 (Trinity Lutheran Church)
- Johann Philipp Hayde, b August 1761 (Trinity Lutheran Church)
- Maria Catharina Hayde, b May 1764 (Trinity Lutheran Church)

A Johan George Hayde (aged 30) arrived from Germany on the Winter Galley in 1738. A George Hayde was Naturalized in Lancaster in 1765. His will⁸ showed that he died 19 November 1772 and his children were George, John, Margaret, Maria, Sarah, Anne and Philipina (these names almost match). Mathias Synder and John Kepp were sons in law.

I have searched the 1790 records for the other children of George but have not found them under Hayde, Hayd, Heyd, Heyde, Heid, Heide, Heydt, Hidy, Hite or Heade. I found Mathias Synder and his family but not John Kepp. Mathias was in Montgomery County with his wife and 7 children in 1790.

A Johan Heinrich Heyde arrived in 1765 and had 10 children between 1780 and 1804. He lived in Phil. I have found no trace of this family.
