

## *Military History*

### *The Colonial Period (Circa 1600 to 1775)*

During this period, many residents participated in local militias in times of peace and during various conflicts, including King William's War (1689-97), Queen Anne's War (1702-13), King George's War (1740-48), and the French and Indian War (1754-63).

### *Revolution (1775 to 1783)*

An estimated 1/3<sup>rd</sup> of the population remained loyal to Britain during the Revolutionary War. As many as 50,000 fled after the war to Ontario, New Brunswick, Nova Scotia and England.

During this war, troops from various German territories fought on the British side. All these troops were known as the "Hessians" because the area of Hesse-Kassel provided the largest contingent of mercenary troops. The Hessian records include the following:

## WW1

In 1917 and 1918, approximately 24 million men living in the US completed a registration card. This represents 98% of men under the age of 46 and close to 25% of the total population.

The LDS has an index to the Roll of Honor (ie deaths) for the Korean and Vietnam campaigns. There were no records under Hayde. Ancestry.com has a record of Korean war casualties. The only Hayde record was:

- Walter J Hayde from Minnesota. He was seriously wounded by a missile on 29 Feb 1952 in North Korea. He was a sergeant in Corps of Engineers.
